The Annual Meeting of the Bethpage Board of Education was held on May 17, 2011, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m. in the High School Gymnasium, 10 Cherry Avenue, Bethpage, New York.

Mr. George Moerler, Chairperson, declared the polls open at 7:00 a.m. Voting proceeded all day. At 9:00 p.m., Mr. Moerler declared the polls closed. The machines were locked and sealed and the inspectors proceeded to tally the 52 valid absentee ballots. One absentee ballots was disqualified by the election inspectors for the following reason; (1) One absentee ballot oath envelope was not signed. There were 7 affidavit ballots.

The results are as follows:

<u>Proposition No. 1: 2011-2012 School Budget</u> – Shall the following resolution be adopted: RESOLVED, that the expenditures for school purposes required for the ensuing year (2011-2012) commencing July 1, 2011 in the total amount of \$74,583,334 set forth in the budget prepared pursuant to Section 1716 of the Education Law, and the levy and collection of necessary taxes therefor, be approved?

MARC SACHS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

by Mrs. Israelton, seconded by Mr. Frost, that the Board of Education approve the creation of an annual Category "B" scholarship to be known as the "Marc Sachs Memorial Scholarship." In accordance with District Policy No. 7421, the scholarship will be established in the amount of \$1,000, donated by Mr. and Mrs. Rolf Sachs in memory of their son, Marc, which will be held in trust by the District. Two (2) \$500 scholarships will be awarded for the Bethpage High School Class of 2011. The number and amount of the scholarship for each succeeding year will be determined by the District Treasurer and the funds available. The scholarship will be given to graduating seniors who are known, not for their academic success, but rather for their ability to make others in the Bethpage community feel genuinely welcomed and included and are known for their friendliness, caring and kindness.

If the donors fail to provide the District with the monies to be held in trust and awarded in a particular year, the District will not hold the funds and the scholarship, as established, will not be given.

2011 ANDREW NARDONE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The District will award this scholarship to the successful candidate selected by the District, in accordance with the criteria submitted by the Donor.
